# **Executive Director & Board Chair Note**

The 2022-2023 fiscal year was full of exciting changes at Green Action Centre. We moved to a new office, welcomed nine new staff members to our diverse team, and added four new volunteers to the Board of Directors. On the leadership front, Compost Winnipeg welcomed a new General Manager in late summer 2022, and Green Action Centre welcomed a new Executive Director at the beginning of 2023. Needless to say, things have been busy while we navigate post-pandemic life and respond to new challenges.

The physical return to the office and delivering our programming in-person has been so rewarding. Live interaction with partners and stakeholders continues to inspire us. Human interaction connects us in a unique way, and our amazing team knows and acknowledges that. It is great to be back!

With no doubt, this was a year of consolidation and growth. We were able to expand several programs including First Nations Waste Minimization (FNWM) and Sustainability Projects. We delivered projects in areas relatively new for us, including green infrastructure and food security. In collaboration with the Climate Action Team, a coalition of environmental organizations in Manitoba, we provided four rural communities (two settlers and two Indigenous) with an empowering program to create their own community climate action plans. In Sustainable Transportation we hosted a sold-out "Transportation for a Strong Town" event, where powerful conversations led by Charles Marohn of Strong Towns ignited our community. Finally our social enterprise, Compost Winnipeg, continued to increase its number of clients, staff and trucks to deliver their mission across Winnipeg. All of these achievements are thanks to an amazing and cohesive team full of great ideas, creativity and hard work.

Our mandate is to promote greener living through environmental education and real climate action to all Manitobans. These last three words - to all Manitobans - resonate with us every day. The partnerships and relationships we build with organizations strongly rooted in underserved communities expose us to a reality we cannot ignore. Those who are facing the biggest economic and social challenges are, at the same time, the most impacted by the effects of climate change. Supporting and providing services to these communities is imperative in our fight for climate justice.

Floods, food insecurity, wildfires, heat waves – we saw climate change coming, and here it is! Now more than ever we need tangible climate action to provide resilience and ensure sustainable, healthy communities for the future. We acknowledge that, collectively, there is still much work to be done by our society to protect our environment now and for future generations, but Green Action Centre remains inspired to act as an agent of change for Manitobans.

We could not complete this report without acknowledging two incredible leaders and humans: Tracy Hucul, former Executive Director, whose legacy has had a profound impact on the success of our organization, and Beth McKechnie, former Interim Executive Director and Program Coordinator at the FNWM program, who selflessly stepped up to steer us through leadership transition and stabilization.

To the entire staff of Green Action Centre and Compost Winnipeg, the Board of Directors, our volunteers and our members, thankyou for your passion and commitment to a greener future for all Manitobans.

# 2022 - 2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of Manitoba First Nation communities supported by the Pathfinders keeps growing! This past year we worked with the following 11 communities: Black River First Nation, Buffalo Point First Nation, Bunibonibee Cree Nation, Fisher River Cree Nation, Garden Hill First Nation, Little Saskatchewan First Nation, Peguis First Nation, Pine Creek First Nation, St. Theresa Point First Nation, Tataskweyak Cree Nation, and Wasagamack First Nation.
- Held the speaker event: Transportation for a Strong Town, featuring Charles Marohn who spoke about his book "Confessions of a Recovering Engineer" to a sold out audience.
- Performed a Waste Reduction Program for École River Heights School, which involved conducting a waste audit with the entire school; 18 classes with a total of 450 students.
- Delivered a Composting and Waste Reduction Pilot for provincial government buildings to assess the effectiveness of staff education and implementation of Compost Winnipeg pickup in reducing the Provincial government's carbon footprint.
- Submitted the summary of Green Action Centre's Indigenous Accord goals and progress since becoming a partner and signatory to the Winnipeg's Indigenous Accord in 2021.
- Increased social media following by 12% across all platforms!









# **POLICY HIGHLIGHTS**

Green Action Centre remained active on policy issues throughout the year, with support and contributions from various program staff, policy volunteer Peter Miller, and other partnering community groups.

**Efficiency Manitoba's Energy Efficiency Advisory Group (EEAG)** - Participated in six meetings to provide input on Efficiency Manitoba's 2024 to 2027 plan, which will be reviewed by the Public Utilities Board later this year.

Manitoba Climate and Green Plan's Second Carbon Savings Account Report -Responded to a survey and submitted a brief to the <u>Expert Advisory Council</u> (EAC) for the creation of its <u>Second Carbon Savings</u> <u>Account report</u>. Of note, the Climate Action Team (of which we are one of the five member organizations) was one of the bodies consulted in developing the report and Green Action Centre was one of two organizations, besides government departments, to submit a brief (the other being Keystone Agricultural Producers).

Manitoba Hydro's Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) - Participated in periodic focus group meetings over the past year. Key inputs from Green Action Centre on the three consultations listed above have been: (a) GHG reduction from alternative transportation modes, waste reduction, and conservation measures, and (b) the electrification of heating and transportation to displace fossil fuels.

**Transportation and Land Use Coalition** (**TLUC**) - Staff member Mel Marginet played a key role in the development and launch of <u>The Anatomy of a Pothole</u> project. This series of essays looks at the larger issues concerning where the City of Winnipeg's priorities lie: our patterns of urban & suburban growth, investment in transit, and addressing environmental and climate challenges.

Standing Policy Committee on Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works (IRPW) - Presented in support of the Neighbourhood Greenway Project to permanently reduce the posted speed limit to 30 km/h on neighbourhood residential streets that were part of the pilot project, which also included traffic calming measures such as new signage, barricades, speed humps, and enhanced pedestrian crossings.

Manitoba Environment and Climate's Revised Draft <u>Transition Plan for Multi-</u> <u>Material Stewardship Manitoba</u> (MMSM) - The First Nations Waste Minimization team submitted feedback on the revised version of MMSM's plan to transition to a fully industryfunded model for recycling residential blue bin materials in the province.

Manitoba's <u>Climate Action Team</u> - CAT team members worked diligently on key policy recommendations. More to come in the 2023-24 report!



# **WASTE REDUCTION**





- Over 1000 people reached through our program events and workshops in the past year.
- Over 150 Master Composter Volunteer hours in our community.
- Delivered both virtual and in-person workshops and events, including new and exciting ones such as a discussion about green burials, Indigenous approaches to composting and gardening, and WasteEd: A Community Compost Drop-off Event (in partnership with Compost Winnipeg).
- Hosted a Food Waste Forum with IRCOM to explore the challenge of food waste among underserved communities in Winnipeg.
  Representatives from organizations serving these communities were invited to discuss the challenges they see and to look for opportunities for solutions and partnerships.
- Helped see Red River Co-op's success in eliminating plastic grocery bags in their stores during our fourth year of partnership.
- Diverted over 300 articles of clothing from the landfill through a Clothing Swap held for Plastic Free July.
- Launched a quarterly newsletter and a revamped toolkit titled "How to Reduce Waste: A Toolkit for Manitoba First Nations and Northern Communities"

# SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS







The Sustainability Projects area helps enhance the capacity of organizations from a climate change and climate adaptation perspective, with a holistic approach and by working together to find better, less carbon intensive ways to operate and deliver services. Some of the programs delivered are:

- Depave Paradise at Rossbrook House removed 58m2 of impermeable pavement, planted 218 plants, and involved 70 community members.
- Skill-building program for newcomers about sustainable transportation and waste reduction, through handson workshops with more than 200 participants.
- Community Building Green Audits in 4 rural communities in Manitoba, two Indigenous - Swan Lake First Nations and Sioux Valley Dakota Nations - and two settlers - Altona and Brandon. This is a project developed by the Climate Action Team.
- Ø Green Audit at Manitoba Arts Council.

# **SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION**







- The GAC Sustainable Transportation team was recognized with a member statement by Lisa Naylor - MLA for Wolseley - in the Manitoba Legislative Assembly for Walk to School Month in October 2022.
- Green Action Centre's first in person Clean Air Day event post pandemic was a success with 433 students from 5 schools attending.
- Visited rural communities including Altona, Manitou and Swan Lake First Nation to deliver sustainable transportation presentations to school aged kids.
- Jack Frost Challenge 2023 saw 1,126 registered participants, 254 teams, 38,927 km logged, 25 communities in Manitoba, 8,081 kg of emissions avoided!
- Commuter Challenge 2022 saw 3,053 registered participants, 339 teams (with 182 of those in Winnipeg alone), 322,556 km of active or sustainable trips were completed and these activities avoided 65,013 Kg of Co2 from going into the atmosphere!
- Bike Everywhere Month 2022 saw over 3000 registrations and reached over 200 Active and Safe Routes to School facilitators.
- Assisted with University of Manitoba's campus commuter survey.

# **OUR SOCIAL ENTERPRISE**





During 2022-2023, Compost Winnipeg provided organic waste collection to more than 900 residential and 250 commercial customers! We welcomed new staff members, a new truck to our fleet and many new customers including the Bruce Oak Recovery Centre and Real Love Summer Festival. We worked with Green Action Centre to develop our strategic plan including mission, values and goals, and an exciting project to recruit multi-family dwellings to composting service. For the first time, we were able to provide our residential customers with a bag of premium organic compost, in partnership with Enviroclean Agriculture. The results were many healthy plants and gardens.

The community support for composting continues to grow, which was evident at the annual pumpkin drop, with over 1,100 people attending and 33,555 kg of pumpkins diverted from the landfill! From restaurants to film sets, schools and restaurants, we look forward to expanding our services and helping our customers reduce their carbon footprint.

# **FIRST NATIONS WASTE MINIMIZATION**



Toolkit Information Booklet



The First Nations Waste Minimization team supports First Nation communities in Manitoba to minimize and divert waste out of their community, and enhance the health of the land, air, water, humans, and wildlife.

- Co-hosted two in-community regional trainings for waste management staff. One in Bunibonibee Cree Nation and one in Peguis First Nation. The two trainings combined included 26 participants from 10 First Nations. This move away from training in an urban center allowed participants to learn in a context similar to their own and build connections with waste management staff in other communities.
- Shared school presentations with the Southeast Collegiate Climate Change Warriors, Black River First Nation elementary school and St. Theresa Point First Nation middle school to a total of approximately 220 students.
- The 2022/23 backhaul collaboration between First Nation communities, Producer Responsibility Organisations, and First Nations Waste Minimization, saw 11 trucks of divertable material hauled out of winter road communities. This included tires, scrap appliances, vehicle batteries, residential recycling, aerosol containers, electronic waste, and more!


